A 10% THANKSGIVING Luke 17:11-19

We all need to give thanks for all that Christ has done for us

I. THE CLEANSED LEPERS (11-14)

A. Their DISEASE (11-12)

- 1. Those infected were on the fringe of society (11)
 - See Lev.13:45-46
- 2. You will notice that these men "stood at a distance" (12)

B. Their DETERMINATION (13)

- 1. A Plan: Get Jesus' attention
- 2. A Pronouncement: "Jesus Master"
- 3. A Plea: Have mercy on us
- 4. A Partnership: Have mercy on us

C. Their DISINFECTION (14)

- 1. The Command from Jesus
 - Go show yourself to the
- 2. The Compliance from the Lepers
 - They were obeying the Master
- 3. The Cleansing from Leprosy
 - Jesus rewarded their trust and obedience

II. THE COMMENDABLE LEPER (15-16)

A. His PRIORITY (15a)

- 1. Immediate response
- 2. Before anything else:

B. His PROCLAMATION (15b)

- 1. He glorified God with a loud voice
- a. His praise was as loud as his plea (Is ours?)
- b. He wasn't embarrassed to make known God's mighty works (Are we?)
- 2. He glorified God before glorying in the gift

C. His POSTURE (16a)

- 1. He fell on his face at Jesus' feet
- 2. The closeness of communion could now be enjoyed and the first one he approaches is Christ!

D. His PRAISE (16b)

- 1. Giving Jesus thanks > While at the same time giving God glory (15b)
- 2. Literally: He kept on thanking Jesus
- 3. A constant, consistent and continued habit of life

III. THE CONCERNED LORD (17-19)

A. JESUS' QUESTIONS (17-18)

- 1. Where are the nine? (17)
- a. Jesus is disturbed and appears to be disappointed
- b. When they could see Him they sought Him but when they got away from Him they forgot Him!
- c. They begged for mercy but neglected thanksgiving
- d. Ingratitude is common: We will be in the majority if we fail to glorify God
- 2. Is this foreigner the only one glorifying God? (18)
- a. A Samaritan leper was doubly repulsive to the Jews and yet he alone is responsive to Jesus!
- b. A Samaritan thanking a Jew!

B. JESUS' CONCLUSION (19)

- 1. You can quit (19a)
 - Jesus had to command the Samaritan to stop and go home
- 2. You are complete (19b)
- a. Note the condition: He was made well > A physical and spiritual completeness
- b. Note the contrast: Ten were cleansed (v.14, 17), but only one was complete

CONCLUSION:

We were Gentiles far from God in a hopeless and cursed condition ...

- But Jesus showed an interest in us and cleansed our sinful souls.
- See Ephesians 2:11-13

By God's grace, we are forgiven foreigners!

- Do we consistently, fervently return to praise God and thank Jesus?
- Might we be among those who are truly mindful about being thankful and not negligent like the 90%.
- Might we be the 10% who are 100% thankful!
