THE RELUCTANT ANGEL

Luke 2:8-14 with Romans 1:14-16

We are called to be messengers of God's great gospel news to all of those around us

I. THE REALITY OF ANGELS

A. ANGELS ARE GOD'S HEAVENLY MESSENGERS

- 1. Their Name: The Greek "angelo" translates into our English word "messenger"
- 2. Their Nature: See Heb. 1:6 & 14
- 3. Their Nativity Notices
- a. Gabriel announced to Zacharias that his son would be the forerunner of Christ
 - Note Luke 1:11-20
- b. Gabriel announced to Mary that she would bear the Messiah Luke 1:26-38
- c. An unnamed angel made several announcements to Joseph
 - See Matt. 1:18-21; 2:13-15 and 2:19-23
- d. Angels announced Christ's birth to shepherds Luke 2:8-14

B. ANGELS ARE GOD'S HONEST MESSENGERS

- Telling others what they need to know

C. ANGELS ARE SOMETIMES HUMAN MESSENGERS

- 1. "To the angel of the church" probably refers to pastors and not heavenly beings
 - See Revelation 2-3
- 2. Today God uses people to announce His message and not heavenly beings
 - Consider Acts 10:1-8 as an example

II. THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ANNOUNCERS - Romans 1:14-16

- Believers are God's human messengers honestly telling others what they need to know.

A. OBLIGATION (14)

- 1. Paul's Situation
 - A responsibility to teach all without discrimination
- 2. Our Assignment
- a. The mission See Mark 16:15; Acts 1:8 and I Thess. 2:4
- b. The question: How are we doing at fulfilling our mission?
- c. The reality: We must not be reluctant announcers (angels)

B. PREPARATION (15)

- 1. Paul's Eagerness
 - A ready herald ... eager to proclaim the gospel
- 2. Our Earnestness
- a. Be prepared to proclaim Rom. 10:14
- b. We are Christ's ambassadors making God's appeal to the lost II Cor. 5:20
- 3. Our Eagerness
- a. What are we prepared to talk about?
- b. We must be prepared to tell others about Christ
- c. We must not be reluctant announcers (angels)

C. DETERMINATION (16)

- 1. Unashamed of the Gospel
- a. The gospel is God's good news
 - Note Peter's boldness in Acts 4:8-12
- b. The gospel is scorned by the world I Cor. 1:18
- 2. Fully assured of its power
- a. Divine dynamite See Acts 26:18
- b. Divine deliverance to everyone who believes Rom. 10:13
- 3. Faithfully proclaiming this message
 - We must not be reluctant announcers (angels)

CONCLUSION:

We wouldn't have Christmas without angel announcements

- Then too we wouldn't have Christians without believers announcements!
