LEADERSHIP AND BEING BAPTIST

I Timothy 3:1-13

Baptists believe that pastors are to provide leadership for their local church.

CLARIFICATION: Baptists believe that each local church should be:

- 1. Governed solely by it's own local congregation
- 2. Led by it's own pastor or pastors
- 3. Served by it's own deacons

I. THE PASTOR'S ROLE AS LEADER

A. AN ELDER OR MODEL - I Tim. 5:17

- 1. The term ("presbuteros") is used in Acts 14:23, I Tim. 5:17 along with Titus 1:5, James 5:4 and I Pt. 5:1
- 2. The term indicates one who is spiritually mature
- 3. This is one who is worthy of emulation
 - See Phil. 3:17, II Thess. 3:9 and Heb. 13:7

B. A PASTOR OR SHEPHERD - I Peter 5:2

- 1. The word ("poimain") designates one who tends and cares for a flock
- 2. This is one who teaches Eph. 4:11-16
 - See also I Tim. 3:2 and I Tim. 5:17
- 3. This is one who preaches I Thess. 2:9 and II Tim. 4:2
 - One who is a herald publically proclaiming his Master's words
- 4. This is one who protects Acts 20:28-31
 - See also Heb. 13:17

C. AN OVERSEER OR LEADER - Phil. 1:1

- 1. The term is used in Acts 20:28, I Tim. 3:1, Titus 1:7 and I Pt. 5:2
- 2. The word ("episopae" > bishop) indicates one who provides direction and administration
- 3. James, the senior pastor at Jerusalem, provides a notable example
 - a. Encouraging his scattered church James 1:1-4
 - b. Advising his confused church Acts 15:13-29
- 4. See also the apostles counsel and the congregation's approval of such in Acts 6:1-6

II. THE PASTOR'S REGULATION FOR LEADERSHIP

- A. QUALIFICATIONS I Tim. 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9
- B. RESTRICTIONS I Tim. 2:11-15
 - Women cannot serve as pastors

C. PROHIBITIONS

- 1. Not a dictator I Peter 5:3
- 2. Not a Diotrephes III John 9-10

III. THE PEOPLE'S RESPONSE TO PASTORAL LEADERSHIP

- A. PAY HIM I Cor. 9:13-14
- B. APPRECIATE HIM I Thess. 5:12
- C. RESPECT HIM I Thess. 5:13
- D. HONOR HIM I Tim. 5:17
- E. PROTECT HIM I Tim. 5:19
- F. REMEMBER HIM Heb. 13:7
- G. OBEY AND SUBMIT TO HIM Heb. 13:17
