A God-Broker helps burdened and broken people

I. THE SITUATION (1-9)

- What brought these kings to Elisha?

A. A NEW KING (1-3)

- Less evil than Ahab

B. A REBEL KING (4-5)

- Mesha the king of Moab had quit paying tribute

C. ALLIED KINGS (6-8)

- 1. Their Partnership (6-7)
- 2. Their Plan (8)
- D. THIRSTY KINGS (9)

II. THE RESPONSES (10-15)

- How do people respond to sudden difficulties and distress?

A. A GOD-BLAMER (10)

- 1. Despairs: Dismayed and in despair when disaster comes
- 2. Gives Up: He assumes that they will be delivered into Moab's hands
- 3. Accuses: This is God's fault

B. A GOD-BELIEVER (11)

- 1. Seeks God
- 2. Discontinues disastrous decisions
 - Neglect of duty should not encourage its continuance
- 3. He understands that sin has consequences there is no water

C. A GOD-BROKER (11b -15)

- 1. His Reputation Shines (11b-12a)
- 2. His position is known (12a)
- 3. He Rebukes Sin (13)
 - Rebuke comes before the revelation
- 4. He Regards the Godly (14)
- 5. He Reveals God's Will (15)

III. **THE REVELATION** (16-19)

- The God-broker helped them discover God's plan

A. GOD'S PRESCRIPTION

- 1. Dig (16) > They had to work and obey
- 2. Attack (19)

B. GOD'S PROMISE

- 1. You will have water (17-18a)
- 2. You will have victory (18b) > God promised something about which they had not asked

IV. THE CONCLUSION (20-27)

- A. THERE WAS WATER (20)
- B. THERE WAS WAR (21-25)
 - Moab's delusion (21-23) and defeat (24-25)

C. THERE WAS WICKEDNESS (26-27)

- 1. The Moabite King succumbs (26)
- 2. The Moabites King sacrifices (27)
- 3. The Moabite King offends (27b)

V. <u>SOME LESSONS</u>

- A. When there is no God-broker God's guidance is not sought and God's blessings cannot be expected (5-9)
- B. When there is no God-broker things go bad, people want a God who bails (11)
- C. Because there was a God-broker people dug without doubting (16)
- D. Because there was a God-broker man's extremity became God's opportunity (17-18)

CONCLUSION:

When people are broken, they need a God-broker

- We may not approve of their agendas, positions or lifestyles, but we can help
