EHUD'S INTRIGUE

Judges 3:16

Let's examine Ehud's true cloak and dagger account!

I. PERSONALLY INSIGNIFICANT (15)

- A. A BENJAMITE: The smallest and least significant tribe
- B. LEFT-HANDED: A unique minority
- C. PAYING TRIBUTE: Acknowledging Israel's conquest (see vs. 12-14)

II. **HUMANLY CLEVER** (16-20a)

- A. PREPARING A WEAPON (16)
 - Getting it ready before it was needed
- B. PRESENTING THE TRIBUTE (17)
 - Perhaps flattering the king or even giving more than was required
- C. DISMISSING HIS ASSOCIATES (18)
 - Not putting them in danger or including them in his bold endeavor
- D. GETTING THE KING ALONE (19-20a)
 - 1. Offering him a "secret" message (19a)
 - 2. Causing the king to dismiss his attendants (19b)
 - 3. Visiting the king on his private roof top (20a)

III. MILITARILY INSIGHTFUL (23-30)

- A. ESCAPING UNNOTICED (23-26)
 - 1. Locking the doors (23)
 - 2. Causing the servants to delay (24-25)
 - 3. Fleeing in a circuitous manner (26)

B. LEADING ISREAL'S ARMY (27-29)

- 1. Alerting the men (27)
- 2. Encouraging the soldiers (28a)
- 3. Seizing the fords of Jordan (28b-29)

C. SUBDUING MOAB (30)

- Giving Israel peace for 80 years

IV. SPIRITUALLY EFFECTIVE

A. RAISED UP BY GOD (15)

- God would use an ordinary man to do extraordinary things!

B. INSPIRED BY GOD (19)

- 1. Note "the idols which were at Gilgal"
- 2. These may be stones that replaced the twelve stones from Joshua 4:1-7
- 3. They might also have been repurposed stones and ascribed to a pagan deity
- 4. Perhaps used by God to cause Ehud to remember God's promises and provisions for Israel See Joshua 4:20-24

C. SPEAKING FOR GOD (20-22)

- Sometimes God speaks in unusual ways!
- 1. Ehud's message (20a)
- 2. Eglon's posture (20b)
 - Standing in respect for God's message
- 3. Eglon's death (21-22)
 - a. A surprising attack (21)
 - b. A successful thrust (22)

D. GLORIFYING GOD (28)

- 1. Calling attention to God's work
- 2. Humbly giving God credit for all that was done

CONCLUSION:

Behind the cloak and dagger is a God-enabled deliverer

- Ehud was not a man with unusual ability but one with availability

Might we be available and God-enabled like Ehud.
