## WHAT HAPPENS AT AWANA CLUB

A typical Sparks and T&T Club meeting (Cubbies have special schedule/activities):

**Opening:** Clubbers open with the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag, the AWANA Pledge, the Awana Song, announcements and prayer.

<u>Handbook Time:</u> During Awana Club each child is given the opportunity to memorize and recite Bible verses, Biblical concepts and activities from their Handbook. All clubs allow for your child to proceed at their own speed in the following handbooks:

Sparks: "HangGlider", "WIngRunner" and "SkyStormer" Handbooks

T&T: "Ultimate Adventure" Handbooks 1 & 2, "Ultimate Challenge" Handbooks 1 & 2

Please take time to assist your child in learning the lessons in the Handbook each week. Your Club leaders want to be sensitive to any special needs your child may have, especially in the area of learning. Please contact your child's Club Director or the FRBC Awana Commander if there are any disabilities or challenges your child may face.

Council Time: Here the clubbers listen to a Bible lesson led by a Bible teacher.

**Game Time:** The clubbers are divided into teams to enjoy a time of safe, fun-filled games.

**FRBC Awana Grand Prix Night: Wed, May 11, 2016**- Clubbers race their own "Pinewood Derby" style cars for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy winners for Speed and Design. Trophies are presented at FRBC Awana Awards.

FRBC Awana Awards: Sunday, 10:00am, May 15, 2016- At the end of the Awana Club year we invite you celebrate with your child's accomplishments.

#### INFORMATION / REGISTRATION

For your child's safety and protection, we ask that all children who participate in the Awana ministry at Franklin Road Baptist Church have a <u>completed current FRBC Awana Contact</u> <u>Information and Permission Authorization Form</u> on file with the child's Awana club Director. Obtain these forms from our Awana Secretary or at Registration Night (see schedule). This form includes telephone number(s) where you can be reached during FRBC Awana, if necessary.

#### SECURITY

Your child's safety is very important to us. Therefore, we are asking that <u>parents/guardians of children sign in their children when arriving at Awana</u>. If another person will be picking your child up, please provide the name of that individual in writing when signing in your child.

It is <u>important</u> that parents/guardians <u>pick up their child immediately following club at 8:00 pm.</u> A parent/guardian (or previously identified other person) <u>must sign out their children when picking them up</u> at the end of the Club night.

We will notify parents/guardians prior to 8:00pm when a child is sick, fussy and not adjusting to the Awana night, or in rare instances for disciplinary reasons.

We require that a "Contact Information and Permission Autorization Form" be completed for each Clubber.

# WHAT <u>NOT</u> TO BRING TO AWANA

- Electronic devices, including cell phones, CD players, Nintendo DSs, etc.
- Toys (unless part of a special announced Awana theme night)
- Food (unless part of a special announced Awana theme night)
- Weapons of any type
- Homework from school

#### **DRESS CODE**

Children and youth attending Awana should wear comfortable clothing including Awana uniform and "tennis" shoes that won't leave black on floors in order to participate in the activities held on a typical evening. Some activities may be difficult to participate in wearing skirts, heels, flipflops, sandals, dress shoes, etc. Should the Game Director deem certain shoes and/or clothing inappropriate or unsafe for participation in the FRBC Awana games he/she will direct the child to sit quietly in the Game room until Game time is over.

## **Awana Grand Prix**



Our annual Grand Prix pinewood derby car race will be held on **Wednesday**, **May 11**, **2016** at **6:30pm**. Only **Awana Car Kits** are permitted to be used for racing which can be purchased for **\$4.00** each. Details about Awana Grand Prix and car availability will be issued as the event approaches and in time for Clubbers to assemble/paint/"customize" their own car.

#### **WELLNESS POLICY**

Children SHOULD NOT attend Awana if they have any of the following symptoms:

- Fever 100 degrees or higher within the last 24 hours
- Vomiting within the last 24 hours
- Diarrhea with in the last 24 hours
- Runny nose if accompanied by others symptoms and/or colored discharge
- Bad Cough coughing increases the chance of infection being spread to others
- Any Rash or other Condition that is suspected to be contagious
- If your child is prescribed with an anti-biotic, they must have been on the anti-biotic for a minimum of 48 hours prior to attending Awana
- Awana personnel cannot administer medication for any Awana Clubber
- All Clubbers will be required to wash their hands after visiting the rest room

Should your child exhibit any of the above conditions, you may be called to pick your child up.

## **DISCIPLINE**

Awana uses two COUNT systems; one for an individual and the other for the group.

The "5" Count is used to bring the group to order. As the Leader counts to "5", the children should become quiet and still.

The "3" Count is used for an individual. The child is given a "one" the first time they have misbehaved and their action is discussed so they understand the suitable behavior. If the child continues to misbehave, then they receive a "two". The child now sits down with an Awana Director or Commander to discuss their behavior. If the child continues to misbehave or be disruptive, they receive a "three". When the child receives a three they are taken to their parents/guardians for the rest of the evening unless not present at the church. If not present, then their parent/guardian will be called. The Leader will discuss with the parent/guardian the reason for his/her action.

Our Awana Leaders realize that there are many family situations that may affect a child's behavior. We encourage you to let your child's Awana Director know if there is any situation that may help us in ministering to your child.

We require our clubbers to:

- Respect God
- Use Proper speech speak to others with respect
- Respect Leaders and others
- Keep their hands to themselves
- Respect the church building and properties
- Walk, do not run
- Always stay with your club
- Listen and follow your club Leader's/Director's directions
- Gum, Candy, Food, Soda, Personal items are **not allowed** during club night, except when offered by club.

• Obey the "5" and "3" count
