RENEWAL TIME II Corinthians 4:16-18

The new year provides us with an opportunity for a fresh start in our walk with God.

God call us to...

I. <u>RENEW OUR COMMITMENT TO SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT</u> (16)

A. WE RESOLVE ...

- To not lose heart
- 1. To maintain momentum
- 2. To forego discouragement
- 3. To be actively engaged

B. WE REALIZE ...

- 1. Decay is natural
- 2. Renewal is spiritual
- a. The inner man is the seat of the soul and spirit
- b. We can have prosperous souls See III John 2
- c. We can be strengthened with might in the inner man Eph. 3:16

C. WE REMEMBER ...

- 1. There is no renewal where there is no regeneration
- 2. When we neglect spiritual renewal we will lack ambition, passion and power
- 3. That we need daily renewal, not weekly or occasional renewing
- 4. We are called to renewal and not reruns!

SUMMARY: We need a daily commitment to godly development.

- Those who lack this backslide!

God calls us to ...

II. <u>RENEW OUR PERSPECTIVE ON SUFFERING</u> (17)

A. OUR ATTITUDE TOWARD TRIALS

- 1. The Reality of the trial
- a. Their significance: Light affliction
- b. Their endurance: Momentary
- 2. Our Response to the trial
- a. A right view of suffering is needed
 - This is nothing in light of eternity
- b. Paul was being crushed (see 4:8-12) but was focused on the outcome and not the immediate.

B. OUR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF GOD

- 1. God's Production: He is working in us
- a. Producing or accomplishing through a prolonged process See Rom. 5:3-5
- b. Example: Joseph's process of coming to power took over 20 years!
- 2. God's Priority: God is working in us for our benefit

C. OUR ACCESS TO HONOR

- 1. The Glory: The pressure produces a prize
- 2. The Greatness: An eternal weight of glory
- 3. The Grandeur: Far beyond all comparison
- D. SUMMARY: We need a renewed perspective on the virtues and value of suffering.

God calls us to ...

III. RENEW OUR FOCUS ON THE ETERNAL (18)

A. OUR ATTENTION: Looking

- 1. This is to thoroughly look or fix attention upon something.
- 2. This action involves concentration

B. OUR ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Focus on temporal, fleeting things that can be seen
 - Note examples in Luke 12:16-21 and II Kings 6;15-18
- 2. Focus on eternal, imperishable things that are invisible
- a. The saints of God II Cor. 3:2-3
- b. The Spirit of God II Cor. 3:17-18
- c. The promises of God II Cor. 7:1
- d. Communion with God James 5:16b
- e. A home with God John 14:1-3

C. OUR ACTIONS

- 1. We tend to go in the direction we look Consider Lot in Gen. 13-19
- 2. We are easily distracted by the obvious Note the 10 spies in Num. 12:27-28, 31
- 3. Where we look determines how we feel about our circumstances
 - See Abraham in Gen. 22:8
- 4. The eyes of faith should be focused on the unseen Heb. 11:1
- D. SUMMARY: We need to reenlist for duty as watchmen of the invisible and eternal.

 This will seem silly to many!

CONCLUSION:

Consider Moses' model behavior - Heb. 11:24-27

- 1. Committed to godly development (24)
- 2. Perceptive about suffering (25-26)
- 3. Focused on the unseen (27)

Consider your Christian walk.

- Are there things you need to renew?
- 1. Your fervor: A passion for spirituality
- 2. Your thinking: A perspective about God's will and ways
- 3. Your focus: A preoccupation with God and the eternal

May God help us to have a fresh and faithful walk with Him in 2013.
