SLAYING GIANTS I Samuel 17:20-51

How many giants are there in I Samuel 17?

One is very popular ... but I believe there are at least three others that had to be confronted and conquered before getting to Goliath.

Let's look at slaying giants in I Samuel 17

I. **THE GIANT OF FEAR** (20-27)

A. THE SITUATION (20-25)

B. DAVID'S RESPONSE (26)

- 1. He rightly responds to the threat
 - Remove the fear-causing element
- 2. He rightly identifies the enemy
- 3. He rightly identifies Israel's army

II. THE GIANT OF RIDICULE (28-30)

A. ELIAB'S RAGE (28)

- 1. Anger
- 2. Accusation

B. DAVID'S DEFENSE (29-30)

- 1. Just a question (29)
- 2. In effect David tells Eliab he is overreacting.
- 3. Turn away from him (30)
 - The giant of ridicule and accusation was overcome by simply walking away!

III. THE GIANT OF PROTOCOL (31-40)

A. DAVID'S OFFER (31-32)

B. SAUL'S EXPECTATIONS (33, 38)

- 1. Only qualified soldiers could fight (33)
- 2. Only equipped soldiers stood a chance (38)

C. DAVID'S EXPLANATIONS (34-39)

- 1. I am qualified (34-37)
- a. I have experience (34-35)
- b. I have confidence (36-37)
- 2. I do not need equipment (39)

D. DAVID'S DETERMINATION (40)

- 1. Equipment: Things with which he was familiar
 - Stick (or staff), stones and sling
- 2. Engagement

IV. THE GIANT OF DEFIANCE (41-51)

A. GOLIATH'S MOCKERY (41-44)

- Disdaining, cursing and threatening

B. DAVID'S MESSAGE (45-47)

- 1. Observation (45)
 - You have weapons but I have an offended God
- 2. Information (46a)
- 3. Publicity (46c-47)
- a. For everyone (46c)
- b. For Israel (47)

C. DAVID'S VICTORY (48-51)

- 1. Running (48)
- 2. Slinging (49)
- 3. Prevailing (50-51)

V. <u>SOME GIANT SLAYING LESSONS</u>

A. DON'T RASHLY ENTER CONFLICTS

- Don't go to battle for your own reputation or in your own power.

B. DON'T NEGLECT BATTLES

- Don't overlook the smaller things that keep you from doing the big things.

C. DON'T QUIT TOO SOON

- Don't think that one victory means the battle is over.

D. DON'T COUNT GOD OUT

- Claim His power and watch Him work wonders
